

How to find us...

Spear House is located in the centre of Bristol, a short distance from Temple Meads train station.

By train

If you are walking or cycling from Bristol Temple Meads train station turn right down Temple Gate and cross the roundabout to the second exit which is Victoria Street. A five minute walk will bring you to us at number 51, on your left hand side.

By bus

If you are coming from the bus station, take the exit towards Broadmead Shopping Centre, crossing The Haymarket onto Union Street. At the top of Union Street, cross Wine Street and walk across Castle Park towards Bristol Bridge. Turn left to cross the bridge onto Victoria Street. We are a couple of minutes' walk from the bridge, on your right.

By car

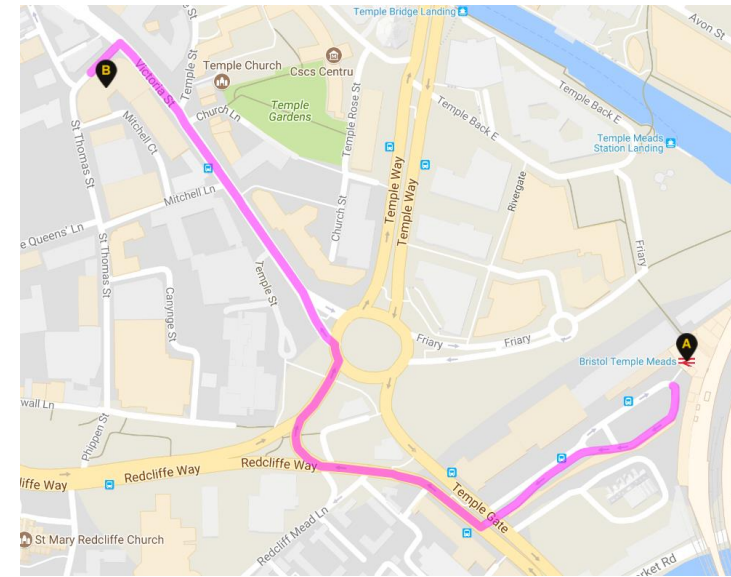
From M4, leave at junction 19 and follow the M32 to Bristol. At the end of the motorway, turn left on to Bond Street. Drive under the bridge and proceed along Temple Way to

the roundabout at Temple Meads.

For Queen Charlotte NCP car park, take the third exit onto Victoria Street and cross the river again. Turn left onto Baldwin Street, left onto Queen Charlotte Street and the NCP is on your left. Walking from the car park, retrace your steps along Welsh Back and back across Bristol Bridge to Victoria Street.

For directions to Portwall car park, follow the above to the Temple Meads roundabout but at the roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto Temple Gate. At the next roundabout, take the 4th exit and continue straight onto Redcliffe Way. At the roundabout, take the 3rd exit onto Redcliff Street and then turn right onto Portwall Lane. Walking from the car park, head back to Temple Meads roundabout then take the first exit Victoria Street.

From M5, join the M4 Eastbound and at junction 19 pick up the M32 into Bristol, following the instructions above.
