



- Organic dairy and meat contains around 50% more beneficial omega-3 fatty acids than non-organic.
- Organic market grew by 4.9% in 2015.
- Soil Association Certification started working with over 370 more businesses and licensed 1,000 new products
- Over 50% of English primary schools now serve Catering Mark standard food
- There are now over 14,800 Catering Mark meals served each day at the National Trust's 134 properties.
- Relaunched organic September campaign reaching 30 million people!









# So what's the problem?

- Our global food supply, our diets and our health are in serious crisis
- 95% of our food comes from the soil
- We need healthy soil to feed the world
- 40% of all agricultural soils in the world are seriously degraded
- Food and farming is responsible for one fifth of UK climate change
- In the last decade, we have lost 75% of UK butterfly species

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- 31% of our bumblebee species are in danger, two are already extinct
- A fifth of children joining primary school are now obese or overweight
- And millions of people are starving across the world
